The West Fife raft, here being escorted by the Maid of the Forth, was skippered by Ian Borland, the club's public relations man.

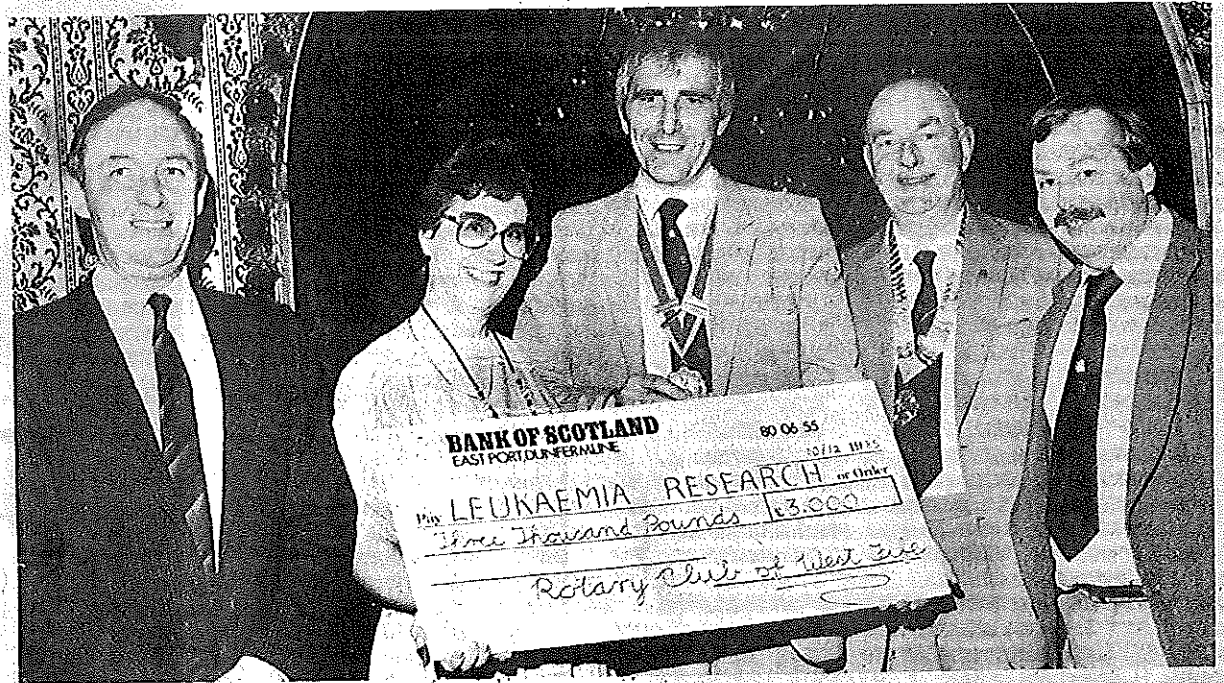
He told us, "It was great fun — but very hard work and I still have the blisters to prove it!"

"I was so exhausted at the end that I fell off the pier into the water while we were trying to haul the raft out."

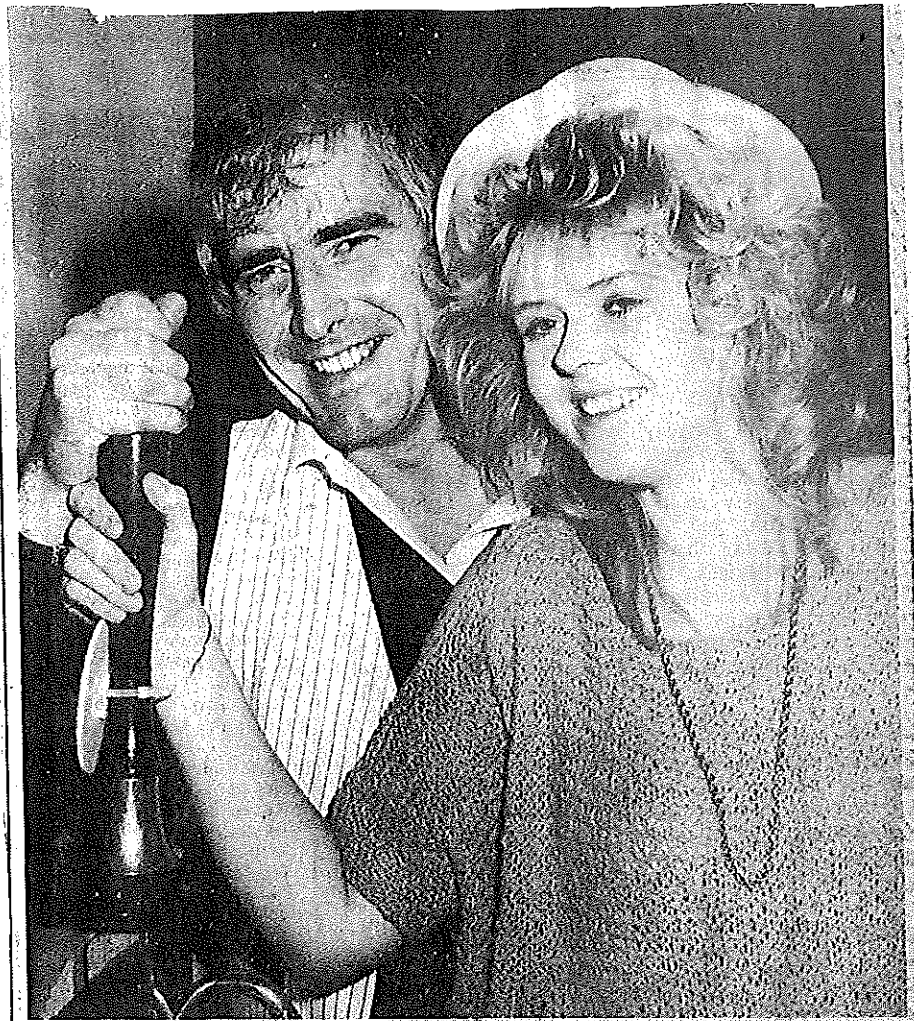
Ian's crew were Brian Forrester, Brian Merrett, Tom Pettigrew, Alex Wong and Drummond Grieve.
